



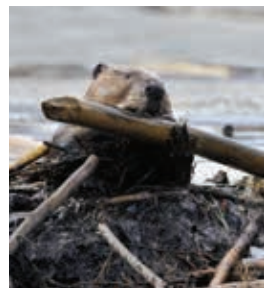

A web will have a bug in it.



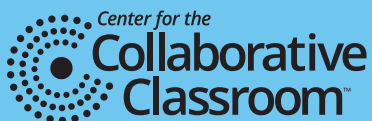
Ducks can swim well.
